PARKING

ACCESS

Please note that we do what we can at the cinema to provide facilities for the disabled. Access to the stalls is currently available via the Brudenell Road fire exit (full assistance provided), there are four wheelchair spaces available in the auditorium. Toilets sadly are inaccessible by wheelchair. Audio Description and subtitles are available for certain films.

BY BUS

You can catch the 56 which leaves regularly from the city centre and stops right outside the cinema. Alternatively, take the 1, 28, 95, 96, 97, or 97A from the city centre and get off at Hyde Park Corner or take the 18 or 18A from the city centre and get off at Cardigan Road, then follow the map to find us.

BY TRAIN

Take a train to Bury Park Station and take the exit which leads onto Cardigan Road. Just a 5-10 minute walk on foot to the cinema - just follow the map.

BY CAR

From the city centre: Follow signs A660 to Skipton (which turns into Woodhouse Lane about a mile outside the centre) and follow the map. From North Leeds: Follow signs to A660 (Otley Road). Hyde Park is in-between Headingley and Leeds city centre. Parking is available around the cinema, on the forecourt or on Hyde Park Corner.

SLEEP FURIOUSLY

Dir. Gideon Koppel **U**19th - 25th June
Documentary

UK 2008, 94mins



Synopsis: Filmmaker Gideon Koppel leads us on a poetic and profound journey into a world of endings and beginnings. The film is set in a small farming community in mid Wales about 50 miles north of Dylan Thomas's fictional village of Llareggub, a place where the director's parents - both refugees - found a home. It is a landscape and population that are changing rapidly as small-scale agriculture is disappearing and the generation who inhabited a pre-mechanised world are dying out. Resisting any traditional documentary structure, Koppel's camera very quietly observes this change as the population grows older, the local primary school faces closure, and the mobile library resists a move into the 21st century. Allied to a soundtrack by the revered electronic musician Aphex Twin, SLEEP FURIOUSLY is lyrical filmmaking at its very best.

FIREFLIES IN THE GARDEN **15**

Academy Award-winning short filmmaker Dennis Lee (JESUS HENRY CHRIST) expands into feature-length territory with this poignant, beautifully played, semi-autobiographical tale. A family gathering in a small university town in the Midwest takes a tragic turn when a car accident injures family head and professor Charles Taylor and kills his wife, Lisa. The animosity between Charles and his novelist son Michael, who lives in New York, runs deep, so his mother's death only exacerbates their hostility. Working with a very fine cast and intelligently deploying flashbacks, Lee reveals the source of these turbulent and troubled ties.

THE GIRL CUT IN TWO **15**

The sharp and darkly seductive THE GIRL CUT IN TWO is trademark Chabrol: fiendishly entertaining and impossible to shake. Gabrielle is an independent, ambitious TV weather girl torn between her love for a distinguished author several decades her senior and the attentions of a headstrong, potentially unstable young suitor. An unspoken past between the two men heightens tensions, and although she's initially certain of her love for one them, the seesaw demands and whims of both men keep confusing - and darkening - matters.

SUNSHINE CLEANING**15**

A single mom and her slacker sister find an unexpected way to turn their lives around in the off-beat comedy from the people behind *LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE*. Once the high school cheerleading captain who dated the quarterback, Rose now finds herself a thirty something single mother working as a maid. Her sister Norah is still living at home with their dad Joe, a salesman with a lifelong history of ill-fated get rich quick schemes. Desperate to get her son into a better school, Rose persuades Norah to go into the crime scene clean-up business with her to make some quick cash.

SUGAR**15**

After tackling the story of a maverick teacher in *HALF NELSON*, film-making partners Boden and Fleck go even further out on a limb with this new film about an ambitious young baseball player from the Dominican Republic. But just as their first film was not your average high school drama, nor is *SUGAR* even close to being just another sports movie. Instead, it's a nimble and insightful study of the persistence and reach of the American dream.

Harvey is about to lose his unfulfilling dead-end job writing advertising jingles when he boards a plane to London. He hasn't turned out a memorable tune in some time, and should he fail to come up with something catchy during his trip, he knows that his boss is ready to let him go. Missing his flight home, Harvey is given the bullet but while drowning his sorrows at the airport he strikes up a conversation with socially impoverished Office of National Statistics employee Kate. They had both assumed that love had passed them by... could this romance be a new beginning?

LITTLE ASHES**15**

1922, Madrid is wavering on the edge of change as traditional values are challenged by the dangerous new influences of jazz, Freud and the avant-garde. Salvador Dalí arrives at university at the age of 18, and his bizarre blend of shyness and rampant exhibitionism attracts the attention of two of the university's social elite — Federico García Lorca and Luis Buñuel. Salvador is absorbed into their decadent group and for a time he, Luis and Federico become a formidable trio, the most ultra-modern group in Madrid. Directed with a keen eye for period detail by Morrison (*WONDROUS OBLIVION*), this is a potent look at creativity and artistic development.

BLUE EYELIDS**15**

In a remarkable feature-film debut, Ernesto Contreras explores solitude and the quest for love. Unfortunately she has no-one to invite as her guest, so she decides to ask Victor, a complete stranger... Beautifully poignant and blackly comic, *BLUE EYELIDS* is a strikingly original debut from a director to watch.

MOONDir. Duncan Jones **15**

Synopsis: It is the near future. Astronaut Sam Bell (Rockwell, *FROST/NIXON*) is living on the far side of the moon, completing a three-year contract with Lunar Industries to mine Earth's primary source of energy, Helium-3. It is a lonely job, made harder by a broken satellite that allows no live communication home. Taped messages are all Sam can send and receive. Thankfully, his time on the moon is nearly over, and he will soon be reunited with his wife, Tess. But, two weeks shy of his departure from Sarang, Sam starts seeing things, hearing things and feeling strange. And when a routine extraction goes horribly wrong, he discovers that Lunar have their own plans for replacing him and the new recruit is eerily familiar.

What we think: This feature film debut from Jones (formerly Zowie Bowie, son of David) is an intelligent and visually accomplished synthesis of *DARK STAR*, *SILENT RUNNING* and *2001*, this is a fascinating study in loneliness and isolation that features a compelling performance from Rockwell at its core.

35 RHUMS - THIRTY FIVE SHOTS 12A

Lionel is a train driver on Paris's rapid-transit rail network. He has been raising his daughter, Joséphine, alone ever since she was a little girl. She has now grown into a young woman. They live side by side, a little bit like a couple, refusing the advances and cares of others. For Lionel, only his daughter counts, and for Joséphine, it's her father who is the most important person in the world.

Little by little, Lionel realises that time is passing by, even for them. The time to leave each other is perhaps approaching.

We meet the young Gabrielle Chanel, illegitimate daughter of a travelling salesman who learns to sew in a Catholic orphanage before her singing ambitions lead her to a cabaret club. It is here where Chanel earns the nickname Coco and also where she catches the eye of several high society gentlemen who would ignite her passion and become instrumental in the development of her remarkable career.

Synopsis: Von Trier's first horror outing since his 1997 mini-series THE KINGDOM sees a grieving couple retreat to 'Eden', their isolated cabin in the woods after a catastrophic incident. There, they hope to repair their broken hearts and troubled marriage. But nature takes its course and things go from bad to worse...

What do we think: A bravura piece of filmmaking from Lars von Trier, ANTICHRIST caused something of a furore at Cannes for its audacious approach to the horror genre. Certainly not for the faint hearted, at its core lie two fiercely committed performances from Willem Dafoe and Charlotte Gainsbourg, who deservedly won the Cannes Best Actress prize. This is a film that simply demands to be seen.

In a Mexican all-star dream team, RUDO & CURSI reunites Bernal, Luna and Cuarón (Y TU MAMA TAMBIEN), in the first project from Alfonso Cuarón, Alejandro González Iñárritu and Guillermo Del Toro's groundbreaking new company, CHA CHA CHA.

The latest film from the legendary Ken Loach is a magical, social-realist work about a football fanatic postman on the verge of a nervous breakdown. Salvation comes in the form of a very special life coach, his hero and Manchester United legend, Eric Cantona. With Cantona nicely sending up his footballer-as-philosopher persona, this is an engaging and accessible work that boasts a characteristically fine script from Paul Laverty, whose collaborations with Loach include SWEET SIXTEEN, AE FOND KISS and Palme d'Or winner THE WIND THAT SHAKES THE BARLEY.

Mann's sprawling historical crime drama follows the efforts of top FBI agent Melvin Purvis in capturing notorious bank robber John Dillinger. A folk hero to the American public thanks to his penchant for robbing the banks many believed responsible for the Great Depression, charming Dillinger was virtually unstoppable at the height of his criminal career making headlines across the country. J. Edgar Hoover's FBI was just coming into formation, and what better way for the ambitious lawman to transform his fledgling Bureau into a national police force than to capture the gang that always gets away?

MESRINE: KILLER INSTINCT TBC

This epic film follows Mesrine's incredible series of hold-ups, prison breaks and kidnappings throughout the '60s and '70s across several continents, as he assumed multiple disguises and identities which led to his nickname 'the man of a thousand faces'. Thirty years since his spectacular death in a hail of police bullets, the César-winning team of writer/director Jean-François Richet and star Vincent Cassel bring to the big screen the story of the man behind the legend.

The cast of non-professionals as well as Bégaudeau ensure that the vibrant script lives up to its true potential.

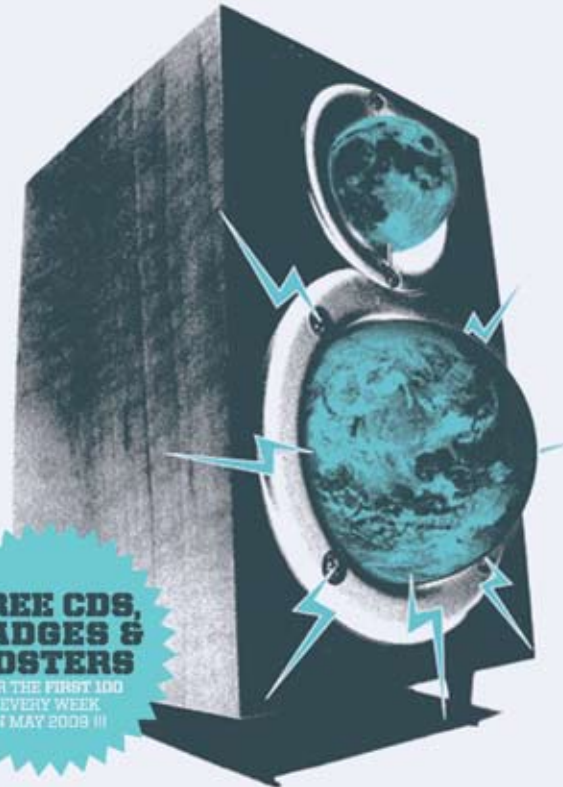

THE CITY BEAUTIFUL is the story of two families struggling to make sense of a world, which keeps pushing them to the margins.
